
CORVETTE Z06 DEBUTS ON OCTOBER 26TH!

The Corvette Z06 has made its debut to what can only be described as INSANE demand. People are posting on Facebook about how they have waited in line to get on a waitlist, wired deposits in excess of \$5,000 and sadly, some have been taken advantage of. There has really not been any official pricing yet, but unconfirmed rumor has it at about \$27,000 over the base car with desirable add-ons quickly getting you to total over \$100K. Not too surprising. So, what is the real lure here? I am sure many of you have read the specs and watched the video. Several points can be made. First, this is a pretty incredible car from ALL reports. Second, if the sound of that engine does not send chills up your spine, then just turn in your keys now. Third, in an age of nothing but hype over the death of the internal combustion engine, this car may be the last real moonshot of pure naturally aspirated adrenalin we will see. And perhaps finally, the price point for performance is 4 times less from similar exotics. Now is there a negative? Yes, maybe a couple to look at and explore. We will see how this shakes out as people drop off due to price or decide they don't want to wait. Hold on to your seats as the review begin to creep out – this is going to be a fun ride.

CORVETTE RACING CLAIMS FINAL GTLM CHAMPIONSHIP!

Chevrolet and Corvette Racing claimed all three full-season GT Le Mans titles of the IMSA WeatherTech Sportscar Championship. This year, Chevrolet claimed its 14th Manufacturers title in GT racing. Antonio Garcia and Jordan Taylor went back-to-back as Drivers champions while the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C8.R repeated as Team title-winners. Chevrolet and Corvette Racing won 7 times in the IMSA Championship and claimed a pole position in each GTLM race heading into Petit Le Mans. No. 4 Corvette C8.R teammates Tommy Milner and Nick Tandy finished second in GTLM points with the start of today's race. Milner and Tandy were also contributors in the Manufacturers Championship with three victories and two pole positions. Corvette Racing will return to IMSA in January for the season-opening Rolex 24 At Daytona in the new GTD PRO category. That effort will go along with a single-car entry in the FIA World Endurance Championship. - *NCM*
