I spend a lot of time in my garage at my workbench working on things that are Corvette related, house project related and even work from home. With the pandemic, I found I spent even more time at the workbench and as a result, the need for a decent chair or stool became PAINFULLY apparent. My first thought was to look for a workbench stool with a backrest and Corvette logo. Didn't find much that I thought would hold up for long. Then I searched the internet looking at various options. Wanted one with casters, a backrest and even some adjustability in terms of height. Finally after a couple of weeks, I found a American company that was making some of the best looking, well-engineered, shop stools I have ever seen. Yes, they are not cheap but you do get what you pay for sometimes and luckily they had a Xmas sale. They engineer and build their stools. They come in several configurations and with some accessories if you like. You can also pay a little extra and have a logo embroidered into the seat. You can also pick some color combinations on the parts to make your stool look like you want. The parts are powder coated and billet aluminum or steel where it counts. I was a little concerned that assembly would be challenging since that has been my experience. Most parts rarely fit together like they are supposed to. In this case, I can report that the stool went together beautifully. The parts fit perfectly with nice tolerances and the result was a shop stool built like a tank. I went with some red powder coated leg braces and basic black cushions. I also ordered the locking casters later because I found that the stool rolls so well that my sloped garage floor caused it to sometimes roll freely away from where I wanted it to stay. Imagine, something rolls so easily its a minor issue. Well, I now have what I think is the perfect shop stool. You can get parts for your stool if you need them and you can upgrade some of the components if you like. They also followed up with me to make sure I had no issues and have been very responsive for questions. I also sent them a few ideas for future enhancements. If you are in the market, check them out.
