BILLY (BROTHER BILLY) HUDSON

Many of you have heard some of us speak about Brother Billy in relation to the Lighthouse Children's Home which we support annually at Christmas through a Corvette Cruise/Pizza Party and donation. Brother Billy was a major force, if not THE major force, behind the ongoing operation and work of the home and had a huge positive impact on the many girls who transitioned through. He had some health challenges in his later years but that never seemed to slow him down much. On August 27th, Brother Billy passed and many of us who had at least a passing acquaintance with him have all felt that loss. Out of respect and admiration for him, we reprint his obituary here.

Billy J. Hudson, passed away on August 27, 2023, with his wife of 66 years by his side. Billy was born in Westville, FL. He graduated from Bonifay High School where he was awarded All

Conference in sports. He joined the U.S. Navy in 1957 and was medically discharged after a year due to having a heart attack. He married his high school sweetheart, Betty and moved to Tallahassee in 1957. He joined the Tallahassee Police Department where he was voted one of the top ten police officers in America in 1971. He retired as Sergeant after 26 1/2 years. He was a Southern Gospel Music DJ and promoter for almost 53 years and in 1973 was voted #1 Gospel DJ with the Gospel in Song program. He was awarded Tallahassee Good Samaritan in 1982. He was a deacon and choir director at Lakewood Baptist Church for many years. Although he was not musically trained, he led one of the largest and best choirs around.

Billy was part of the founding of the Lighthouse Children's Home in 1977, where teen girls would have "A Place of Second Chances". He served as the current President. Billy spent his retirement full time volunteering in the ministry.

He enjoyed bream fishing but most of all had a heart to help children, teens and families in need while telling them about the Lord and living as mentor for others.

Billy is preceded in death by his parents W.E. and Litha Hudson, brothers, Ben Hudson, Bud Hudson, Doye Hudson, Willard D. Hudson and sisters Lillian Carroll, Pearlie Harrell, Edna Beagles, Laura Grant, Nancy Grantham, Pauline Youree, Hazel Allen and Barbara Bratcher and son-in-law Buddy Land.

Billy is survived by his wife, Betty Hudson, daughter, Theresa Land, grandchildren, Jeffery Hurdle (Kaitlyn), Billy Land, Bethann Phillips (Scott) and great granddaughter Layla Phillips and sister-in-law Sherry Hudson.
